Information to prepare you for space travel ...

Camperships – The Council is committed to the principle that every Scout deserves a summer camp experience. Campership assistance is available to all. Applications must be submitted no later than May 31st along with a registration form and a \$50 non-refundable deposit. If a full campership is approved the deposit will be refunded. If a partial campership is awarded, the difference must be paid before July 17, 2009. Contact your unit leader or visit our Council website for an application. Campership applications are due May 31st.

Refund Policy – Each session requires a \$50 non-refundable deposit. The balance is refundable if requested prior to July 15th. Camp fee minus \$200 if withdrawal is made on or after July 15th. Requests must be made in writing to the Council Resource Center. No refund requests will be accepted after August 31st. Please contact your unit leader or visit the Council website for a Refund Request Form.

Physicals – A current physical evaluation is required for all Scouts and adults who attend resident camp. Proper medical forms are as follows: Youths and adults under 40 years old must have a current physical, signed by a physician, within 36 months prior to end of camp. Adults 40 and over must have a current physical, signed by a physician, within 12 months of the end date of camp. Medical forms are available at the Council Resource Center or on the website.

Health & Safety – Our camp Health Lodge is staffed 24 hours a day by a Registered Nurse. Sequassen meets or exceeds BSA National Resident Camp Standards and complies with all Connecticut laws for youth camps.

How to sign up – You may attend with a unit (Pack or Den) or as an individual Scout and parent or partner. If you want to attend with your unit, contact your unit leadership for guidance. If you are attending as a lone Scout and parent or partner, applications are available on the website or you can call Carolyn, (203) 876-6868, Ext. 273, at the Council Resource Center.

Preferably a Scout attends with his parent (one on one) but no more than three Cub Scouts or four Webelos may attend with one adult.
